

## TOEFL TEST OF ENGLISH AS A FOREIGN LANGUAGE

All non-native speakers must take the official TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) within six months of the application date. This is part of the application process at the Josephinum, and this requirement includes those applicants, sponsored by a U.S. diocese, for whom English is a second language. The results of this examination should be sent to the Registrar's Office when application is made to enter either the College of Liberal Arts or the School of Theology.

Those seminarians with a score of **550** on the TOEFL ITP (paper-based test), **213** on the TOEFL CBT (computer-based test), or **80** on the TOEFL iBT (internet-based test) will be eligible to enroll in a full-time college/theology schedule. Those with scores less than 550/213/80 will take only English as a Second Language (ESL) courses until they attain the target score. In most cases, the English language studies will last a minimum of one year. (English as a Second Language Services)

The TOEFL examination is administered at the Josephinum and in many locations throughout the United States and abroad. For information concerning dates and locations for the tests, contact:
